West Virginia Christian Education Association FINE ARTS GENERAL INFORMATION 2021-2025

WVCEA holds three Fine Arts Festival per year-Senior High, Junior High, and Elementary.

Senior High (Grades 9-12) is held at approximately the same time every year (the second or third week-Thursday and Friday--in March. It is held on the campus of Appalachian Bible College (near Beckley, WV). Judges are acquired from Christian colleges, local universities, surrounding area churches, as well as Appalachian Bible College. This Festival is a full two-day event, beginning with non-timed events on Thursday, and ending with an Awards Assembly on Friday. Art is brought on Thursday and judged that day so it will be ready for display on Friday.

Junior High and Elementary (Grades 7-9 and Grades 4-6) consists of two competitions held on two consecutive days, and is normally held approximately 6-7 weeks after the Senior High and has been held on a rotating basis at those facilities large enough to accommodate the Festival. Judges are acquired in the same manner as for Senior High, and many judges adjudicate for both. This Festival is run similarly as a two-day event beginning with non-timed events and Art judging, and ending with an Awards Assembly on Friday.

Registration: Registration amount for each individual performing alone or in a group that is 6 people or fewer is \$7. Groups that contain 7-12 people will be charged a single fee of \$75. Groups of 13-24 people will be charged a single fee of \$100. Groups that include 25 or more students will be charged a single fee of \$150. Registration is done on-line through the WVCEA website. Fees are due upon receipt of bill from FACTS.

Academic Tests: Academic tests are administered/ overseen on site at each school by the school's staff. WVCEA will provide academic testing online. WVCEA acquires its tests from a variety of sources, including Tennessee Association of Christian Schools, South Carolina Association of Christian Schools, and Old Dominion Association of Christian Schools as well as writing many of its own. There is a general 3-year rotation of tests.

WVCEA Fine Arts Coordinator: The WVCEA Fine Arts Coordinator is a part-time position. The duties include coordinating all Fine Arts events with the WVCEA secretary; making sure tests are prepared or ordered, judges are procured, things are lined up for the sites, awards are ordered, etc. Policy is defined and decided by the WVCEA Fine Arts Coordinator, in conjunction with the Executive Director and the Executive Board of WVCEA. The Fine Arts Coordinator is the director of the actual events of each Fine Arts Festival.

Rules and Guidelines for Fine Arts: For Senior High, WVCEA rules are from the AACS National Competition Manual. Each school is required to have its own copy of this manual (now in disc form), and WVCEA adheres strictly to it. As a state, West Virginia does have additional categories that are for state competition only since they are not in the National Manual. For the Elementary/Junior High levels, WVCEA publishes an addendum to the National Manual with slight changes for these levels (such as abbreviated speech time limits, less strict requirements for some of the art, etc.). Judges' forms, for the most part, come from the National Competition Manual.

Individuals receiving "Superior" or "Excellent" ratings who do not place 1st, 2nd, or 3rd will receive ribbons. For Elementary/Junior High, awards are given for "Superior" and "Excellent" ratings for individuals. Awards are also given for groups for these ratings. These awards are passed out at the end of each Festival.

The above limitations per individual include both individual and group events. Exclusions to these limitations are Choir, Choral Group, Orchestra/Band, Handbell Choir, Bible Quizzing and Chess. Example: A student may participate in 6 events at the Senior High Fine Arts Festival (5 events for Junior High/Elementary) on the day of the Festival and still have 3 arts entries, take 5 academic tests, plus be involved in Choir, Choral Group, Band, Handbell Choir, Bible Quizzing and Chess. On rare occasions a student may be granted special permission by the WVCEA office to extend his/her limit of entries to 7.

*The decision was made in 2010 following considerable discussion at the August Fine Arts Coordinators Meeting that on rare occasions, acceptance of requests from individual schools to exceed the school limit of entries for performance events would be at the discretion of the Fine Arts Director and/or the WVCEA office.

^{**}Note for Chess Players: Sometimes to make the number of chess players appropriate for a tournament, the Fine Arts Director and Chess Tournament Director may allow additional players from a school to participate.

WVCEA FINE ARTS REGISTRATION POLICIES

REGISTRATION DUE DATES

Registrations are due and the fees are payable on the published due dates. FACTS will send an invoice of the total owed, but it is the responsibility of each school to determine the correct total amount owed and send payment when due. Registrations may be done before the deadline, but fees are still to be received by the published due date.

ADDITIONS, CHANGES AND CANCELLATIONS

Each **registered** school will have a one-week substitution period (beginning with the registration due date and ending one week later) submit changes through the wvcea website. Limited additions may also be made during this week at the regular registration rate. **After that week the following is in effect:**

- No additions will be accepted after the one-week substitution period. (Changing categories is considered an addition.) We try to be gracious about late-caught mistakes, but please check over your registrations.
- Substitutions must be made within the same category; i.e. Dramatic Reading John Smith will be performing instead of David Jones. Substitutions include changing the name(s) of a performer(s) or replacing "TBA" with a student's name. There will be no charge for making this change during the substitution period; after the substitution period, the charge will be \$2.00 per change. TBA's are allowed for this one-week substitution period only, and it is the school's responsibility to notify the WVCEA office of the TBA names.
- Cancellations may be made after the one-week substitution period, but no refunds will be issued after that time. Advance notice of cancellations allows for smoother scheduling.
- All changes must be completed before 5:00 p,m. Friday before the Festival (one week before). These changes need to be submitted through the wycea website.
- In cases when extreme inclement weather may hinder your registration process, an extension of time may be granted. However, you must contact the WVCEA office by **email** on or before the registration deadline to make those special arrangements.

LATE REGISTRATIONS

Schools whose registrations and/or fees are received later than the published due dates will be assessed a **Late Registration Fee** of \$10.00 per Festival or Academic Tests. Schools not registering by the end of the one-week substitution period will not be eligible to participate at that particular Fine Arts Festival.

WVCEA ELEMENTARY SWORD DRILL GUIDELINES AND INSTRUCTIONS

Judging Personnel Needed (5): Moderator, Scorekeeper and 3 Line Judges

- 1. Students should be divided into rounds of no more than 8 students per round. They can draw numbers for the rounds or be pre-assigned for the rounds.
- 2. Tape should be placed on the platform to form a line. All participants should stand behind the tape facing the moderator and the audience. The moderator should sit at a table or in the pew and use a microphone.
- 3. Bibles (supplied by WVCEA) shall be held straight up (elbows unbent) over the head with one arm, having the other ann down at the side. The moderator shall give the Scripture reference twice; then, say "Charge!" The students then look up the verse, and step over the tape line with their finger on the verse.
- 4. There should be at least 3 line judges on the platform with the students (off to the side). One line judge will be assigned to watch for the first person over the line. That judge will then position him(her)self next to that person and verify that the student's finger is *on* the verse just called. Another line judge will be assigned to watch for the second person over the line, and then the 3rd line judge will watch for the 3rd person over the line. Each judge will then stand by that person, verify that the student does have his/her finger on the correct verse, then give that person's name (and "first"\ "second" or "third") to the scorekeeper.
- 5. The student's finger *must be on* the verse, not moving to it. If the student is on an incorrect verse of is *moving* to the verse and not on it, 10 points will be deducted.
- 6. 10 points are given to the 1st person, 5 points are given to the 2nd person, and 3 points are given to the 3rd person finding the correct verse. The students do not read the verse.
- 7. A round is complete whenever one person reaches 70 points. The 1st place person will have 70 points, whoever has the next most points will be considered 2nd, and the next highest will be considered 3rd. The final round will consist of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place students from each preliminary round. The final round will conclude when someone reaches 100 points. That person will be the winner; second place will be the person with the second highest number of points, and third place will be the person with the third highest number of points.

NINTH GRADE PARTICIPATION

9th graders will be allowed to participate in either or both Junior High and Senior High divisions.

Individual Participation: For individual participation, 9th must choose one division or the other. They may choose, for example, to participate in Senior High in piano solo and choose to participate in Junior High for vocal solo. However, they cannot participate in both divisions for the *same thing*. If they wish to be eligible for AACS National Competition, their individual performance must be entered on the Senior High level. For all categories that are considered to be individual categories by AACS, 9th graders must make a choice of either Senior High or Junior High.

Group Participation: 9lh graders may participate in either or both divisions. Please be aware that billing occurs for each division.

AREA ONE: Bible

Bible Quizzing: There will be *one* combined Bible Quizzing team on the Junior High/Elementary level. This level will quiz from a reduced number of chapters than the Senior High. That assignment will be published by WVCEA.

Preaching: Preaching is limited to young men in grades 7-9 only; it is limited to the category of Evangelistic Preaching.

Bible Teaching: Bible Teaching is limited to students in grades 7-9 only.

Sword Drill: Limited to students in grades 4-6 only. Each school may enter no more than 3 students.

AREA TWO: Music

Instrumental Solos: Junior High and Elementary Brass, String, Woodwind, Percussion and Recorder (EL) instrumental solos may be performed *with or without* printed music (memorized or not memorized). We want to encourage Junior High and Elementary students to attempt more technically challenging pieces without the additional concern of memorization and disqualification; however, memorization is a good thing.

Vocal Solos: Only **one** (1) selection of medley within a 5-minute time limit is required.

AREA THREE: Speech

Limitation of Categories: Debate, Original Persuasive Oratory and Extemporaneous Speaking are not offered on the Junior High/Elementary level.

Acceptability: No ..author unknown" pieces are acceptable. This is also a rule on the Senior High level.

AREA FOUR: Art

Kits: The only acceptable ldts are for cross stitching.

Acceptability: No paint-by-number anything, no tracing, and no painted ceramics are allowed.

Art Judging Forms: Coordinators supply judging forms in all areas, including Art.

Note: the judging form for the Junior High/Elementary level is different from the Senior High judging form. The student must provide his/her own **Artist's Idea Statement** (located in the judging forms section). Only **one** (1) copy must accompany the student's art work, and it must be signed.

Identification: All participants in art (including photography) must use the *Art Exhibition Tag*, which is now available on the WVCEA web site under the AACS Category Rules tab.

AREA FIVE: Academics

Tests: Tests will be administered to two separate levels: Junior High- grades 7-9

Elementary - grades 4-6

Tests are unlimited on all levels

Categories: Academic tests will be offered for only these categories: Old Testament Knowledge, New Testament Knowledge, English, Mathematics, Science, Geography/History, Creative Writing: Poetry, and Expository Writing: Essay, Spelling and Music Theory (Junior High has one additional test: Microsoft Office). These are the tests for which you register in February or March and that are administered at the individual schools.

Mathematics: the test shall consist of questions covering General Math and Algebra.

Science: the test shall consist of questions covering life, earth, and physical science.

Geography/History: the test shall consist of questions covering world (including U.S.) geography, history and civics.

Spelling: All competing students will take a written spelling test as an academic test at their own school; the oral Spelling Bee competition will be for those that score the highest. The suggested percentage would be approximately 34% of all those who took the written spelling test (unless there would be a low amount of entries). These top students would be notified immediately after their tests were scored so they could continue preparing for the live competition. There will be one (1) Spelling Bee for each level (Junior High and Elementary). The Spelling Bee will be single elimination.
